

Mr. Knight, from the Committee on Finance, reported favorably the following bills:

First. House bill entitled an Act to pay to Harry E. Loane, the sum of 103 dollars and 5 cents, for balance due him for work on the Comptroller's Office, per certificate of the Comptroller and President of Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company.

Second. House bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay Jethro McCauley, late collector of State taxes in the 3d district of Cecil county, the amount overpaid by him into the Treasury.

Which were read the second time.

Mr. Stevens, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported unfavorably,

House bill entitled an Act for the prevention of intemperance amongst the young men of Maryland.

Which was adopted.

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Bannon submitted the following message:

House bill entitled an Act to further amend the charter of the Baltimore and Drum Point Railroad Company,
