they remain in their possession, or in that of their agents unsold; hospitals or asylums, charitable or benevolent institutions, so far as used for the benefit of the indigent and afflicted, and the ground which the buildings used as such hospitals, asylums, charitable or benevolent institutions shall actually cover and the equipments owned by by such corporations or institutions.

Which were adopted.

Said bili, as amended, was then read the second time.

On motion by Mr. Walsh, it was

Ordered, That the Chairman of the Committee on Claims be directed to pay to C J. Fox, Official Reporter of the Senate, the same per diem as allowed the Journal Clerk.

Mr. Getty, from the Committee on Finance, reported fa-
