SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the sum of five thousand six hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purposes mentioned in the first section of this act, and if said sum shall not be sufficient to pay said owners in full the same be distributed among them by said Comptroller of the Treasury pro rata

**Chapter 148.**

AN ACT to prevent trespass with dog or gun upon private property in Kent county, and repeal the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter fifty-seven, entitled "An Act for the protection of partridges, rabbits, and to prevent trespass on private property," so far as it applies to said county.

SECTION 1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That any person found trespassing with dog or gun on any private property in Kent county shall be liable to be arrested by any constable of the county, and shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before any justice of the peace in said county shall be fined the sum of five dollars, and on failure to pay said fine shall be confined in the jail of said county for a term of ten days.

Not to trespass with a dog or gun.

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the fines collected under the provisions of this act shall be paid by the justice of the peace collecting the same to the County Commissioners, to be by them placed in the hands of the treasurer of the County Game Association, should there be one, and if not, into the hands of the treasurer of the State Game Association, to be used for the increase and protection of game in Kent county.
