

and said county commissioners and the comptroller of Baltimore city aforesaid shall pay to the several clerks of Circuit Courts of the counties and the clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore city for recording, indexing and preserving the records of marriage license, for each name so inserted, indexed and recorded, five cents.

Chapter 358.

AN ACT to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Employees' Relief Association.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John W. Garrett, William M. Clements, Samuel R. Johnson, N. E. Chapman, Andrew Anderson, David Lee, William Franklin, William H. Harrison, G. M. Supell, Arthur Sinsell and William T. Bernard, and their successors, chosen as a committee of management and a board of trustees in the manner hereinafter provided, shall be a corporation under the name of "The Baltimore and Ohio Employees' Relief Association," the objects of which shall be to extend relief in cases of sickness, injury, old age and death, to the employees of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company and their families, and also to the employees of such other railroad companies as this association may permit to participate in its benefits, and to the families of such employees; to receive deposits on interest from said employees and their wives, and to loan them money at lawful rates of interest, in order to provide them with or to improve homesteads, and to generally promote their welfare; it shall be a condition precedent to the making of any engagements by this association for either of the above mentioned purposes, that the directors of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company shall, by resolution, guaran-
