

Caroline County, any of the beverages herein mentioned, but it shall be unlawful to sell any of said beverages on Sunday, or in any drug store at any time.

378. Any person, firm, corporation, or association desiring a license for the sale of the beverages herein mentioned shall file with the County Commissioners of Caroline County an application therefor in such form as may be prescribed. Before the license is issued, the County Commissioners of Caroline County shall satisfy themselves of the moral character and financial responsibility of the applicant, appropriateness of the location where such licensed business is to be conducted, taking into consideration the number of such licenses already issued, and generally as to the applicant's fitness for the trust to be reposed. Before any license is issued under this sub-title, the applicant shall give to the County Commissioners of said County a bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) conditioned for the lawful and proper use of said license and with the said County Commissioners named therein as obligee. Each license shall designate the place of business of the licensee. Each application for license shall contain:

First: The name and residence of the applicant, and how long he has resided within Caroline County.

Second: The particular place for which a license is desired, designating the same by street and number if practicable; if not, by such other apt description as definitely locates it.

Third: The name of the owner of the premises upon which the business licensed is to be carried on.

Fourth: A statement that the applicant applying for a license in his or her own behalf, or as the representative of a firm, corporation or association, is a citizen of the United States and of the State of Maryland, and has been a resident of Caroline County for not less than five (5) years immediately preceding the date of the application, that he is not less than twenty-one (21) years of age, and that such applicant has never been convicted of a felony, or been adjudged guilty of violating the laws governing the sale of intoxicating liquors or for the prevention of gambling in the State of Maryland.

Fifth: This application must be verified by the affidavit of the petitioner made before a Notary Public or other person duly authorized by law to administer oaths. If any false statement is made in any part of said application the applicant or applicants shall be deemed guilty of perjury,
