

Treasurer to pay. ### Chapter 112.

AN ACT to repeal section six of article thirty-five of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Elections," as repealed and re-enacted by chapter three hundred and seventy-four of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Repealed and re-enacted. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section six of article thirty-five of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Elections," as repealed and re-enacted by chapter three hundred and seventy-four of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted as follows :

Judge of election failing to attend. SEC. 6. At any election, federal, state or county, hereafter held in this state, if any one or two of the judges so appointed shall fail to attend at the place of election at the time prescribed for opening the election, the county commissioners, or a majority of them, shall appoint a judge or judges in the place of the judge or judges failing to attend, provided that one of the three judges shall always be of a different political party from themselves, or a majority of themselves ; and in case the said commissioners, or a majority of them, cannot be convened, or do not fill such vacancy before the hour for opening the election, the remaining judges or judge who shall so attend shall appoint a judge or judges in the place of the judge or judges failing to attend, the judge or one of the judges so ap-
