

Chapter 264.

AN ACT to amend article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Marrying Unlawfully," by adding thereto an additional section forbidding marriages between white persons and persons of negro descent to the third generation, to be known and distinguished as section one hundred and thirty-three A.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Marrying Unlawfully," be amended by adding thereto the following additional section, to be known and distinguished as section "one hundred and thirty-three A."

SEC. 133A. All marriages between a white person and a negro, or between a white person and a person of negro descent, to the third generation inclusive, are forever prohibited, and shall be void; and any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of an infamous crime, and punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than eighteen months nor more than ten years.

Chapter 265.

AN ACT to protect the health of those employed in factories, manufacturing establishments and workshops in this state.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all factories, manufacturing establishments or workshops in the state shall be kept in a cleanly condition and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy or other nuisance, and no factory, manufacturing establishment or workshop shall be
