

so overcrowded while work is carried on therein as to be injurious to the health of the persons employed therein, and every such factory, manufacturing establishment or workshop shall be well and sufficiently lighted and ventilated in such a manner as to render harmless, as far as practicable, all the gases, vapors, dust or other impurities generated in the course of the manufacturing process or handicraft carried on therein, which may be injurious to health.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That if any person, firm or corporation, managing or conducting any factory, manufacturing establishment or workshop in this state, shall neglect any of the requirements of this act, or do or permit to be done in the factory, manufacturing establishment or workshop conducted or managed by him, them or it, any act contrary to the provisions of this act, he, she, they or it shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof in a court of competent jurisdiction, be fined one hundred and fifty dollars for each offence so committed.

Chapter 266.

AN ACT to amend article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, title "Crimes and Punishments," by adding thereto an additional section under the new sub-title of "Conspiracy."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, title "Crimes and Punishments," be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following additional section, under the new sub-title of "Conspiracy."

SEC. A. An agreement or combination by two or more persons to do, or procure to be done, any act in contemplation or furtherance of a trade dispute between employers and workmen shall not be indictable as a conspiracy, if such act committed by one person would not be punishable as an offence; nothing in
