ADDISON, JOHN (?-ca. 1705/6). BORN: in Westmoreland, England; younger son. IMMI-GRATED: in 1674 as a free adult from England. RESIDED: in St. Mary's County; Charles County, by 1687; Prince George's County, after 1695. FAM-ILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: probably Launcelot Addison, M.A. BROTHERS: Thomas; Henry, both merchants at Whitehaven, Cumberland, England; probably Launcelot, chaplain to King Charles II: and Anthony, rector of Abingdon and chaplain to the Duke of Marlborough. MARRIED by 1677 Rebecca (?-1726), widow of Thomas Dent (ca. 1630-1676); daughter of Rev. William Wilkinson. Her sister was Elizabeth, who married William Hatton (?-1712). CHILDREN. SONS: Thomas Addison (1679-1727), who married first, Elizabeth, daughter of Thomas Tasker (?-1700), and second, Elinor (1689-1761), daughter of Walter Smith (?-1711). STEPSONS: William Dent (ca. 1660-1704); Thomas Dent; Peter Dent (ca. 1665-1710/11); and George Dent (?-1702). STEP-DAUGHTERS: Margaret Dent; Barbara Dent (1676-?), who married Thomas Brooke (ca. 1659-1730/31). PRIVATE CAREER, EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Anglican. SOCIAL STA-TUS AND ACTIVITIES: member of a socially ascending family in England; Gent., ca. 1670; Esq., after 1692; established a powerful political family in Prince George's County. OCCUPATIONAL PRO-FILE: merchant; Indian trader; planter; the ship, Liverpool Merchant, of which he owned a share, was condemned and its cargo seized for violation of the Navigation Acts, 1679-1682. PUBLIC CA-REER, LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Associators' Convention, Charles County, 1689-1692; Grand Committee of Twenty, 1690-1692; Upper House, 1692-1693 (Accounts 1; Laws 1), 1694-1697 (Accounts 1: Laws 7), 1697/98-1700, 1701-1704, 1704-1705 (died before the 4th session). OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFFICES: Council, 1692-1705; justice, Provincial Court, 1692-1694; judge, Court of Chancery, 1693; associate chancellor, 1696; associate commissary general, 1699-1700. LOCAL OFFICES: justice, Charles County, 1687-1692; coroner, Charles County, 1691; Piscattaway (King George's) Parish Vestry, Charles County, 1693-1705. MILITARY SERVICE: captain, Charles County, 1689-1694; colonel, Charles and Prince George's counties, 1694-1705. STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES: his active support of the revolution of 1689 led to his first provincial offices. WEALTH DURING LIFE-TIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: at least 3,289 acres. RESIDED: in King George's Parish, Prince George's County. FAMILY BACK-GROUND, FATHER: Thomas Addison (1679-1727), son of John Addison (?-ca. 1705/6). MOTHER: Elinor (Eleanor) (1689-1761), daughter of Walter Smith (?-1711). HALF UNCLES: William Dent (ca. 1660-1704); Peter Dent (ca. 1665-1710/11). AUNTS: Lucy Smith (1688-1770), who married Thomas Brooke (1683-1744); Anne Smith (1694-1759), who married second, Thomas Trueman Greenfield (1682-1733); and Rebecca Smith (1696-1737), who married Daniel Dulany (1685-1753).
