

**ENNALLS (ENNOLDS, ENNALS), THOMAS** (?–1718). BORN: probably ca. 1663, probably in York County, Virginia; eldest son. IMMIGRATED: by 1668 as a minor with his parents from Virginia. RESIDED: in Dorchester County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: *Bartholomew Ennalls* (1643–1688). MOTHER: Mary Heyward. BROTHERS: William; *Joseph Ennalls* (?–1709), who married Mary, daughter of *John Brooke* (by 1646–1692/93); *Henry Ennalls* (1675–1734), who married Mary, daughter of *Henry Hooper* (ca. 1643–1720); and Bartholomew. HALF BROTHERS: Francis Heyward; John Heyward. SISTERS: Elizabeth, who married *Roger Woolford* (1670–1730); Mary. MARRIED Elizabeth (1664/65–1739), daughter of *Roger Woolford* (?–ca. 1701/2). She subsequently married *William Holland* (?–1732). Her brother was *Roger Woolford* (1670–1730). Her sister was Sarah, who married *Govert Lookerman* (ca. 1681–1728). CHILDREN. Died without progeny. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: second generation burgess. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: mariner, 1689; planter; merchant, trading with Madeira. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Dorchester County, 1692–1693, 1694–1697, 1697/98–1700 (Laws 4), 1701–1702 (Laws 1; appointed to the Council before the 4th session); Upper House, 1703–1704 (appointed by the 4th session, but never sat), 1704–1707, 1708A, 1708B–1711 (did not attend the 1st or 3rd sessions), 1712–1714 (did not attend the 1st or 4th sessions), 1715, 1716–1718. OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICE: Council, 1703–1718. LOCAL OFFICE: justice, Dorchester County, 1690–1703 (quorum, 1694–1703). MILITARY SERVICE: captain, 1690; lieutenant colonel, by 1700; colonel, by 1701/2–1718. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: at least 2,864 acres inherited from his father. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: by October 21, 1718. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £4,661.17.11 current money (including 38 slaves and 3 servants). LAND: ca. 5,000 acres.

**ENNALLS, THOMAS** (?–by 1783). BORN: in Dorchester County, of age by 1757; elder son. NATIVE: fourth generation. RESIDED: in Dorchester County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: Dr. Joseph Ennalls (1709–1756), son of *Henry Ennalls* (1675–1734). MOTHER: Mary (?–ca. 1772), widow of Thomas Haskins (?–1735); daughter of *Govert Lookerman* (ca. 1681–1728) and wife Sarah Woolford. AUNT: Sarah Lookerman (?–by 1745), who married *Joseph Cox Gray* (?–1764). BROTHER: *Henry Ennalls* (ca. 1741–by 1788). HALF BROTHERS:

William Haskins (1729–1779), who married in 1759 Sarah (?–1786), daughter of Rev. Thomas Airey (1701–1765) and wife Elizabeth Pitt; Joseph Haskins (1731–?), who married in 1759 Sarah, daughter of Thomas Ennalls (?–1746) and wife Ann Skinner. SISTERS: Mary (1738–?), who married in 1765 James Sulivane (1737–?), son of *Daniel Sulivane* (ca. 1708–by 1783); Margaret (?–by 1795), who married *William Maynadier* (1747–1795); Rebecca (?–by 1767); and Henrietta. HALF SISTER: Elizabeth Haskins (1733–1805), who married in 1754 Hall Caile. FIRST COUSIN: *James Murray* (?–1784). MARRIED by 1761 Mary, daughter of *Daniel Sulivane* (ca. 1708–by 1783); stepgranddaughter of *Peter Taylor* (1680–ca. 1747/48). Her brothers were James (1737–?); *Daniel Sulivane* (ca. 1748–1799). CHILDREN. DAUGHTER: Sarah (1761–1842), who married *Henry Waggaman* (1753–1809). PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Gent., by 1776. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: mariner. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Conventions, Dorchester County, 3rd, 1774, 4th, 1775, 5th, 1775. MILITARY SERVICE: captain, by 1766; colonel, Lower Battalion, Dorchester County Militia, commissioned, 1776. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: at least 1,002 acres in Dorchester County (at least 200 acres inherited from his father; 500 acres by deed of gift from an uncle or great-uncle; 302 acres by patent). WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: between March 1776 and 1783, probably in Dorchester County; size of estate unknown. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS: in the tax assessment of 1783 his widow was charged with 945 acres in Dorchester County and an assessed personal property value of £248.0.0, including 4 slaves.

**ENNALLS, WILLIAM** (?–1731). BORN: in Dorchester County, of age by 1710; eldest son. NATIVE: third generation. RESIDED: in Dorchester County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: *Joseph Ennalls* (?–1709), son of *Bartholomew Ennalls* (1643–1688). MOTHER: Mary, daughter of *John Brooke* (by 1646–1692/93). UNCLES: *Thomas Ennalls* (?–1718); *Henry Ennalls* (1675–1734). AUNTS: Elizabeth Ennalls, who married *Roger Woolford* (1670–1730); Ann Brooke, who married first, *Thomas Cooke* (?–1692/93). BROTHERS: *Bartholomew Ennalls* (ca. 1700–1783); Joseph (1702–1759); Thomas (?–1753); and Henry (?–1734). SISTERS: Elizabeth (?–by 1739), who married *Charles Goldsborough* (1707–1767); Mary, who married *Henry Hooper* (ca. 1687–1767). FIRST COUSIN: *Thomas Woolford* (ca. 1699–ca. 1750/51). NEPH-
