Joseph Richardson's Company, 14th Battalion, Caroline County Militia, commissioned May 24, 1776; 1st lieutenant, Caroline County Militia, by June 29, 1776; 1st lieutenant, 4th Maryland Battalion of the Flying Camp, commissioned July 17, 1776; captain, Stafford's Company, 14th Battalion, Caroline County Militia, commissioned June 24, 1777, resigned by July 24, 1780; captain, 19th Regiment, Caroline County Militia, appointed June 18, 1794, resigned by August 22, 1794. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** PERSONAL PROPERTY: 2 slaves, 1783; 15 slaves, 1790; 12 slaves, 1798; 26 slaves, 1800. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: administration bond dated September 28, 1801, in Caroline County; size of estate unknown.

LOOKERMAN (LOOCKERMAN), GOVERT (ca. 1681–1728). BORN: ca. 1681, in Dorchester County; second son. NATIVE: second generation. RESIDED: Dorchester County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: *Jacob Lookerman* (1652–1730). MOTHER: either Elinor or Dorothy. BROTHERS: Jacob (1678–1731); John (1686–1760); Thomas (?–ca. 1714); and Nicholas (1697–1771). HALF BROTHER: Thomas. SISTER: Mary. NEPHEW: *Jacob Hindman* (by 1713–1766). MARRIED Sarah (1672/73–by 1730), daughter of *Roger Woolford* (?–ca. 1701/2) and wife Mary Denwood. Her brothers were *Roger Woolford* (1670–1730); Levin (1683–1721); and James (ca. 1680–1758). Her sisters were Mary (ca. 1663–?), who married *Henry Hooper* (ca. 1643–1720); Elizabeth (1664/65–1739), who married first, *Thomas Ennalls* (?–1718), and second, *William Holland* (?–1732); Rosannah (1666/67–?); and Ann (1675–?). Her first cousins were Priscilla Covington, who married *Robert King* (1689–1755); Elizabeth Covington, who married *Benjamin Wailes* (?–ca. 1728/29); Sarah Covington (1683–1755), who married first, *Edward Lloyd* (1670–1718/19), and second, *James Hollyday* (1696–1747); and Elizabeth (Betty) Denwood (1674–1736), who married *George Gale* (1671–1712). Her niece was Mary Woolford (?–1780), who married *Henry Waggaman* (?–ca. 1761). CHILDREN. SONS: Jacob,

OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter; officeholder. **PUBLIC CAREER.** LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Dorchester County, 1712–1714 (Aggrievances 1; Laws 2–4). LOCAL OFFICES: sheriff, Dorchester County, 1706–1708; clerk, Dorchester County, 1710/11–1728; visitor, Dorchester County Free School, 1723. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: over 769 acres. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: in 1728; inventory made August 18, 1728, in Dorchester County. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £316.6.12 current money (including 4 servants and 6 slaves); FB, estate overpaid £14.11.10.

LOOKERMAN (LOOCKERMAN), JACOB (1652–1730). BORN: in 1652, in New Amsterdam. IMMIGRATED: in 1677, as a free adult from New York. RESIDED: in St. Mary's County ca. 1678; Dorchester County, by 1683. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: Govert Lookerman (?–1671), who was born in Turnhout, the Netherlands, and immigrated to New Amsterdam in 1633. He was chief merchant and Indian trader of New Netherlands, often in partnership with Isaac Allerton, Pilgrim father; member of elected board of Nine Selectmen of New Netherlands in the 1640s; owned a packet boat, *The City of Amsterdam*. He married first, Ariaentje Jans. MOTHER: Marritje, widow of Thymen Janzen, daughter of Tryn Jansen. HALF SISTERS: Marritje (1641–?); Jannetie (1643–?). MARRIED first, Elinor, probably the daughter of Nicholas Keiting (Ketin) of St. Mary's County. MARRIED second, Dorothy. CHILDREN. SONS: Jacob (1678–1731), sheriff of Dorchester County in 1730, who married Magdalen (1679–1739), widow of James Edmondson (1670–1702), daughter of *John Stevens* (?–1692); *Govert Lookerman* (ca. 1681–1728); John (1686–1760), who married first, Mabel Dawson, and second, Mary; Thomas (?–ca. 1714), who probably died at sea; Nicholas (1697–1771), who married Sally Emerson; and Thomas, who married first, Vienna, and
