

literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican; subscriber to Christ Church Parish, Calvert County. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Gent., by 1773; third generation legislator. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Calvert County, 1779 (elected to the 2nd session of the 1778–1779 Assembly to fill vacancy). **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Calvert County, 1773; Christ Church Parish Vestry, Calvert County, 1781—at least 1786, 1794; commissioner of the tax, Calvert County, 1783—at least 1786, 1790, 1792, 1798. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. PERSONAL PROPERTY:** assessed value £1,292.2.6, including 26 slaves and 27 oz. plate, 1783. Held bonds totaling ca. £1,000, which he assigned to his daughter before his death. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** 2,315 acres in Calvert County (all inherited from his father). **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** sold 538 acres in Calvert County in 1793; purchased 500 acres in Calvert County in 1797. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** in December 1799 in Calvert County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £3,373.13.3 current money (including 44 slaves, 9 oz. plate, 1 pair spectacles, and books); FB, £747.1.2. **LAND:** 2,277 acres in Calvert County.

MADDOX (MADDUX, MATTOX), LAZARUS (ca. 1656–1716/17). **BORN:** ca. 1656, in Northampton County, Virginia. **IMMIGRATED:** by 1663 as a minor with his stepfather and family from Virginia. **RESIDED:** in Manokin Hundred, Somerset County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** Alexander Maddox (?–ca. 1659/60), who immigrated from London, England to Virginia by 1645. **STEPFATHERS:** by 1661/62 William Bozman (?–1664/65); James Caine. **MOTHER:** Eleanor (?–1694). **BROTHER:** Alexander (ca. 1654–1717), who married Mary (last name unknown). **STEP-BROTHER:** *John Bozman* (1650–1716). **MARRIED** by February 1679/80 Sarah. **CHILDREN. SONS:** Daniel; William; Thomas (1684/85–1762); Lazarus (1690–1735/36); and Alexander (1693–?). **DAUGHTERS:** Mary (1679/80–?), who married first, *John Waters* (?–1708), and second, John Cottman; Sarah (1681/82–?), who married Thomas Walker; Eleanor, who married Robert Scott; and Elizabeth. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Protestant. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Somerset County, 1692–1693 (elected to the 1st session of the 1692–1693 Assembly to fill vacancy). **ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:** The Upper House proceedings re-

ported the appearance of “Mr. Lawrence Mattox” to be sworn as a delegate for Somerset County. In all other records the name is given as Lazarus. **STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES:** apparently reluctant to support the Protestant Associators’ Revolution, 1689. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** possibly patented 900 acres in Somerset County by 1692. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** between January 18 and March 19, 1716/17. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, at least £396.1.12 (including 11 slaves). **LAND:** at least 1,600 acres in Somerset County.

MADDUX (MADDOX, MATTOCKS, MATTOX, MATTUX), THOMAS (?–1783). **BORN:** of age by 1773. **NATIVE:** probably; if so, second generation. **RESIDED:** in Princess Anne Hundred, Somerset County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** John Maddux of Somerset County, a planter. **MARRIED** by 1782 Elizabeth. **PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION:** literate. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Esq., at death. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** attorney; took oath as attorney in Somerset County on May 20, 1777. **PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Somerset County, 1777 (elected to the 1st session to fill vacancy; Laws to Expire 1), 1777–1778 (Grievances 1; Manufactories 1; Laws to Expire 1), 1778–1779 (Elections 1), 1780–1781 (Laws to Expire 2). **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. PERSONAL PROPERTY:** assessed value £59, including 21 oz. plate, 1783. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** 100 acres in Somerset County (inherited from his father). **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** purchased 1 lot in Princess Anne Town and 18 acres in Somerset County, ca. 1782; sold 4 acres in Somerset County, 1783; disposed of the 100 acres he had inherited from his father by 1783. **WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED:** administration bond dated July 4, 1783, in Somerset County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £257.11.5 current money (including 17 oz. plate, 52 volumes of law books, and 1 other book); FB, estate overpaid £32.12.5. **LAND:** 14 acres in Somerset County.

MAGRUDER, ALEXANDER HOWARD (1745–1782). **BORN:** in 1745, probably in Prince George’s County. **NATIVE:** fourth generation. **RESIDED:** Prince George’s County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER:** Alexander Magruder (1716–1779), a Prince George’s County landowner and son of Alexander Magruder (1671–1746) and wife Susanna. **MOTHER:** Elizabeth Howard (1725–?). **BROTHERS:** Leonard, a minor in 1779; William;
