

43–1682); and Anne Calvert (1644–ca. 1714), who married first, *Baker Brooke* (1628–1678/79). **MARRIED** in 1683 Anne (?–1711), widow of Lucas, sixth Viscount Dillon of Costello, daughter of Richard Nugent, Earl of Westmeath. **CHILDREN**. Died without progeny. **PRIVATE CAREER**. **EDUCATION**: literate, probably well educated. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION**: Catholic. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES**: Talbot arrived with appointment as a councillor. In 1671 he translated from the Latin *The Discoveries of John Lederer*, which he published in London in 1672. He succeeded to the baronetcy in 1671, and returned to Ireland to manage his family estate. Talbot was a close friend of his cousin *Charles Calvert, 3rd Lord Baltimore* (1637–1714/15). He was later called Sir William Talbot of Listarton, County Meath. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE**: placeman, planter. **PUBLIC CAREER**. **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE**: Upper House, 1671 (served only during the 1st session of the 1671–1674/75 Assembly). **OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICES**: Council, 1670–1671; justice, Provincial Court, 1670–1671; secretary, 1670–by 1673; judge of probate, 1670–1671. **OUT OF COLONY SERVICE**: master of rolls (vice-chancellor), Ireland, 1689–1690; member of Parliament, Meath, 1689. **STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES**: attainted in 1691 and baronetcy was forfeited. **WEALTH AT DEATH**. **DIED**: on May 18, 1691, in Galway, Ireland.

TALBOTT, WILLIAM (?–1713). **BORN**: probably in Lancashire, England. **IMMIGRATED**: by 1692, probably as a free adult. **RESIDED**: in Baltimore County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND**. **BROTHER**: Thomas, of Lancashire, England. **MARRIED** Katherine (?–ca. 1762), daughter of George Ogg and wife Elizabeth. Her brothers were John (1691–?); George, Jr. (1696–?). Katherine subsequently married Capt. John Risteau (?–1760), of Baltimore County. **CHILDREN**. **DAUGHTER**: Margaret, who married in 1735 Benjamin Hammond (1706/7–?), brother of *Thomas Hammond* (1693–?). **PRIVATE CAREER**. **EDUCATION**: literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION**: Protestant. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES**: a taxable in the households of Nicholas Corbin, 1692, and Thomas Richardson, 1694; began active career in 1701; Gent., by 1708. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE**: factor for George Purchas and Company, London; merchant. **PUBLIC CAREER**. **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE**: Lower House, Baltimore County, 1712–1713 (election declared void during the 1st session of the 1712–1714 Assembly; reelected to the 2nd session and attended until he was “very sick”; died during or immediately after this session).

LOCAL OFFICE: justice, Baltimore County, by 1702–1713. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME**. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION**: at least 1,174 acres in Baltimore County. **WEALTH AT DEATH**. **DIED**: between November 9 and November 16, 1713; will probated in Baltimore County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY**: TEV, £199.15.1; FB, estate overpaid, £4.12.3. **LAND**: at least 1,174 acres in Baltimore County.

TALL, ANTHONY (?–1678). **IMMIGRATED**: by 1662, as a free adult. **RESIDED**: in Dorchester County. **MARRIED** Elizabeth (?–1701). **CHILDREN**. **SONS**: Philip (?–1705/6), who married Hannah; Anthony, Jr., a cooper. **PRIVATE CAREER**. **EDUCATION**: illiterate. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES**: transported wife and son Philip by 1663; first evidence of land ownership in 1663; no record of any other offices held by him or his sons. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE**: planter. **PUBLIC CAREER**. **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE**: Lower House, Dorchester County, 1678 (elected to the 2nd session of the 1676–1682 Assembly, but died before that session commenced). **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME**. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION**: 100 acres. **WEALTH AT DEATH**. **DIED**: between April and June 15, 1678, in Dorchester County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY**: TEV, at least 3,817 pounds of tobacco. **LAND**: at least 100 acres.

TANEY, MICHAEL (1750–1820). **BORN**: in 1750, in Calvert County. **NATIVE**: fifth generation. **RESIDED**: at “Berry,” also called “Taney Place,” a property lying between Battle Creek and the Patuxent River in Calvert County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND**. **FATHER**: Michael Taney (?–1758). **STEP-FATHER**: George Wheeler. **MOTHER**: Jane, daughter of Ignatius Doyne (?–1763) and wife Mary, of Charles County. **HALF AUNT**: Sarah Taney (ca. 1744–by 1784), who married *Ignatius Fenwick* (?–1784). **BROTHERS**: Thomas; Joseph (1755–1844), who married in 1776 Dorothy (1756–1817), daughter of Roger Brooke (1714–1772) and wife Elizabeth Boarman, and who moved to Frederick County. **MARRIED** ca. 1770 Monica (1752–1814), daughter of Roger Brooke (1714–1772) and wife Elizabeth Boarman. Her brothers were Basil (1748–?), who married Ann, daughter of James Duke and wife Mary; John (1753–1790), who married Mary Wheeler. Her half brothers were Roger (?–1776), who married Mary; John, a twin (1737–died young); Bowyer, a twin (1737–1815), who married first, Mary Browne, and second, Hannah Reese. Her sisters were Elizabeth; Dorothy, who married in 1776 Joseph Taney
