UTIE (UTYE), NATHANIEL (ca. 1635–ca. 1675/76). BORN: ca. 1635, in Virginia; probably second son. IMMIGRATED: in 1656, as a free adult from Virginia. RESIDED: on Spesutia Manor, Baltimore County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: John Utie (?–ca. 1638), who immigrated to Virginia by 1623, was a member of the Virginia House of Burgesses, 1623–1624, 1629, 1629–1630, and a councillor of Virginia, 1630. STEPFATHER: *Richard Bennett* (ca. 1608–1675). MOTHER: Ann. BROTHERS: John, who married Mary (last name unknown); *George Utie* (?–1678). HALF BROTHER: *Richard Bennett* (ca. 1639–1667). HALF SISTERS: Elizabeth Bennett, who married Charles Scarborough of Accomack County, Virginia; Anne Bennett (?–by 1694), who married first, Theodorick Bland (?–1671), and second, *St. Leger Codd* (ca. 1634–ca. 1707/8). MARRIED first, in 1661, Mary (?–1665), widow of Lawrence Ward of Nansemond County, Virginia, possibly the daughter of Rev. Joshua Maplefort of Lincolnshire, England. Mary died on Spesutia Manor of knife wounds inflicted by a slave. MARRIED second, ca. 1667/68, Elizabeth (?–1699), daughter of Col. John Carter (?–ca. 1670), Esq. of Corotoman, Lancaster County, Virginia, who immigrated to Virginia ca. 1649, and was a member of the Virginia House of Burgesses and Council, and wife Jane Glyn. Elizabeth was the stepdaughter of Eleanor Eltonhead Brocar; Anne Carter; Sarah Ludlow; and Elizabeth Shirley. Her brothers were John (?–1690), who married first, (first name unknown) Lloyd, and second, Elizabeth Traverse; George. Her half brothers were Robert (1663–1732), who married first, Judith Armistead, and second, Elizabeth Landon Willis; Charles (ca. 1669–?). Elizabeth's dowery was £600.0.0; she subsequently married both *Henry Johnson* (?–1690/91) and *Edward Boothby* (?–1698). CHILDREN. SON: John (?–by 1675). PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate, probably attended Harvard College, 1651–1655. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Esq., by 1658; very high status on arrival in Maryland, where he quickly established a manor and became the largest landholder in the new county of Baltimore. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: merchant, in partnership with Henry Meese, merchant of London, 1658; Indian trader; planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLA-

TIVE SERVICE: Upper House, special writ 1658, 1659/60; Lower House, Baltimore County, 1662; Upper House, special writ 1664 (Utie was issued a special writ for the 2nd session of the 1663–1664 Assembly); Lower House, Baltimore County, 1666 (Laws), 1669 (Aggrievances); Upper House, 1674–1674/75 (appointed by the 3rd session of the 1671–1674/75 Assembly). OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICES: Council, 1658–1660, 1674–ca. 1675/76; justice, Provincial Court, 1658–1660, 1674–ca. 1675/76; agent for the colony to New Netherlands, 1659. LOCAL OFFICE: deputy commissary, Baltimore County, 1675. MILITARY SERVICE: colonel, by 1658. STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES: appointed to the Council in 1658 for his ability and “affectionate service” in the Assembly earlier that year; supported Fendall's Rebellion in 1659/60 and lost his Council seat; pardoned for his role in the rebellion, 1661. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: 850 acres in Anne Arundel and Kent counties, plus an additional 2,300 acres in Baltimore County surveyed in 1658. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: between August 12, 1675, and January 18, 1675/76; estate probated in Baltimore County. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, 105,013 pounds of tobacco (including 3 slaves, 7 servants, and 116 oz. plate); FB, 33,278 pounds of tobacco; principal heirs were the children of his brother *George Utie* (?–1678). LAND: probably ca. 4,000 acres in Baltimore, Anne Arundel, and Kent counties.

VANDERHEYDEN, MATTHIAS (?–1729). BORN: probably in New Amsterdam. IMMIGRATED: in 1686, as a free adult from Delaware. RESIDED: in Cecil County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: probably Matthys Van der Heiden (?–1659) of New Amsterdam. BROTHER: John. MARRIED ca. 1686 Anna Margretta, widow of *Henry Ward* (?–1683/84), daughter of Augustine Herman (?–1686) and wife Jane. Her brothers were *Casparus Augustine Herman* (1656–1697); Ephraim (ca. 1651–1689). Her sisters were Judith, who married first, *John Thompson* (?–ca. 1701/2), and second, John Dowdell (?–1728); Francina (ca. 1662–?), who married Joseph Wood. Her nephews were *Joseph Wood* (?–1738); *Ephraim Augustine Herman* (1683–1734/35); *Richard Thompson* (ca. 1680–1775); and *Augustine Thompson* (1691–1738/39). Her niece was Augustina Herman, who married first, *Thomas Frisby* (1681–ca. 1715/16), and second, *Roger Larramore* (?–1721). CHILDREN. STEPSON: *Henry Ward* (?–1734). DAUGHTERS: Jane, who married (first name unknown) Coatts (Couatts), a mer-
