Her sisters were Jane (1761–1825); Sarah. **CHILDREN.** SON: name unknown (1787–died young). **DAUGHTERS:** Sarah Fendall (1781–1786); Eleanor Lee (1782–1826), who married Joseph Kent (1779–1837), governor of Maryland, 1826–1829; Catherine Lloyd (1784–1784); and Catherine Lloyd (1785–1786). **PRIVATE CAREER.** **EDUCATION:** It is not known where Wallace received his medical training. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** possibly Anglican. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Esq., by 1794. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** physician; planter. **PUBLIC CAREER.** **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Cecil County, 1786–1787 (Grievances 1). **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Cecil County, 1785–1794; justice, Orphans' Court, Cecil County, 1787—at least 1792. **MILITARY SERVICE:** surgeons mate in Smallwood's Maryland Regiment, January 14–December 1776; furnished medicine to Smallwood's Regiment by order of the Council, 1776; surgeon, First Maryland Regiment, December 10, 1776–1777 (resigned); surgeon to the hospitals and infirmary, Annapolis, 1777. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** 4 slaves, 1790. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** no evidence of land ownership. **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** acquired by inheritance and purchase 1,164 acres in Cecil County, 1786. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** on September 24, 1794, in Cecil County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £1,370.17.3 current money (including 2 slaves, plate, medicine, and books); FB, estate overpaid £83.17.3. **LAND:** 1,164 acres in Cecil County.

WALLIS, HUGH (1711–1766). **BORN:** on June 30, 1711, in Shrewsbury Parish, Kent County; fourth son. **NATIVE:** second generation. **RESIDED:** in Kent County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** **FATHER:** *Samuel Wallis* (?–1724). **MOTHER:** Anne Beck (?–1729). **BROTHERS:** Henry (1702/3–?); Samuel (1705–1766); John (1709–1761); and William (1714/15–1757). **SISTERS:** Ruth (1706/7–?); Margaret (1712–?). **MARRIED** Hannah Brooks. **CHILDREN.** **SONS:** John (1743/44–?); Samuel (1746–1807); William (1751/52–1814), who married Isabelle Maxwell; and Hugh (1757–by 1817). **DAUGHTERS:** Ann (1740–?), who married *Isaac Perkins* (1743–1791); Hannah (1741/42–?), who married first, Thomas Perkins, and second, by 1807, (first name unknown) Bordley; Araminta (1749–?), who married Fred Perkins; and Ruth (1754–?), who married John Brooks. **PRIVATE CA-**

REER. **EDUCATION:** probably literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican, Shrewsbury Parish, Kent County. **SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES:** Gent., 1749. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter; merchant. **PUBLIC CAREER.** **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Kent County, 1754 (elected to the 5th session of the 1751–1754 Assembly to fill vacancy), 1754–1757. **LOCAL OFFICES:** justice, Kent County, by 1747—at least 1751; Shrewsbury Parish Vestry, Kent County, 1751–1754. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** 874 acres in Kent County and 1 lot in Chestertown, Kent County (inherited 300 acres, bought 53 acres and 1 lot). **SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN LAND BETWEEN FIRST ELECTION AND DEATH:** acquired 800 acres in Kent and Queen Anne's counties, 1756–1769. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** Administration bond dated November 16, 1766, in Kent County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £4,443.18.5 (including 43 slaves); FB, £1,303.11.8. **LAND:** 1,754 acres in Kent and Queen Anne's counties and 1 lot in Chestertown, Kent County.

WALLIS (WALLACE), SAMUEL (?–1724). **IMMIGRATED:** by 1702, probably as a free adult with his family. **RESIDED:** in Cecil County; Kent County by 1708. **MARRIED** by 1702/3 Anne (?–1729), widow of (first name unknown) Beck. **CHILDREN.** **SONS:** Henry (1702/3–?); Samuel (1705–1766), who married Elizabeth; John (1709–1761) of Kent County, a farmer, who married Hannah; *Hugh Wallis* (1711–1766); and William (1714/15–1757) of Queen Anne's County, who married Elizabeth. **DAUGHTERS:** Ruth (1706/7–?), who married John McDaniel; Margaret (1712–?), who married in 1729 John Hurtt (Hurt). **PRIVATE CAREER.** **EDUCATION:** literate. **RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION:** Anglican, Shrewsbury Parish, Kent County. **OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE:** planter. **PUBLIC CAREER.** **LEGISLATIVE SERVICE:** Lower House, Kent County, 1708A (election voided at county level because Wallis stated he did not meet the property qualification), 1722–1723 (died before the 3rd session of the 1722–1724 Assembly). **LOCAL OFFICE:** Shrewsbury Parish Vestry, Kent County, 1703–1704, 1709–1710, 1712–1717, 1718–1724. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** **LAND:** received warrant for 1,100 acres in Kent County in 1705. Patented 1,114 acres in Kent County, 1714–1723. **ADDITIONAL COMMENT:** in addition to the above mentioned lands, Wallis and William Comegys of Kent County, planter, patented 1,234 acres and sold 885 acres in Kent County between 1704 and 1724. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** **DIED:** by April 6, 1724,
