**WOOLFORD (WOOLLFORD), THOMAS** (ca. 1699–ca. 1750/51). BORN: ca. 1699, probably Dorchester County; elder son. NATIVE: third generation. RESIDED: in Dorchester County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: **Roger Woolford** (1670–1730), son of **Roger Woolford** (?–ca. 1701/2). MOTHER: Elizabeth, daughter of **Bartholomew Ennalls** (1643–1688). UNCLÉS: **Thomas Ennalls** (?–1718); **Henry Ennalls** (1675–1734); and **Joseph Ennalls** (?–1709). AUNTS: Mary Woolford (ca. 1663–?), who married **Henry Hooper** (ca. 1643–1720); Elizabeth Woolford (1664/65–1739), who married first, **Thomas Ennalls** (?–1718), and second, **William Holland** (?–1732); and Sarah Woolford (1672/73–by 1730), who married **Govert Lookerman** (ca. 1681–1728). BROTHER: John (?–1750), who married Mary Brown. SISTERS: Rosanna, who married first,

(first name unknown) Tootle, and second, (first name unknown) Wood; Sarah, who married John Jones; and twins Mary (ca. 1691–?), who married Capt. John Pitt (Pitts), and Elizabeth (ca. 1691–?), who married Thomas Hicks, son of **Thomas Hicks** (1659–1722). MARRIED by 1725 Sarah, daughter of John Stevens (ca. 1670–1743) and wife Anne Brooke Cooke. Sarah was the granddaughter of both **John Stevens** (?–1692) and **John Brooke** (by 1646–1692/93). She was the niece of Mary Brooke, who married **Joseph Ennalls** (?–1709). Her brother was John Stevens, Jr. (?–ca. 1752), who married Priscilla Hooper. Her first cousins were **John Edmondson** (1692–1743); **William Ennalls** (?–1731); **Bartholomew Ennalls** (ca. 1700–1783); Elizabeth Ennalls (?–by 1739), who married **Charles Goldsborough** (1707–1767); and Mary Ennalls, who married **Henry Hooper** (ca. 1687–1767). OTHER KINSHIP: Sarah's mother's first husband was **Thomas Cooke** (?–1692/93). CHILDREN.
