A bill, entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money to the Chippawa Tribe, No. 19, Improved Order of Red Men.

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill, entitled, An act to authorize and empower Mary Ann Biggs, a minor of the State of Delaware, to divide certain real estate, and to convey by good and sufficient deed or deeds, such part thereof as may be necessary to complete such division, and to accept and hold her proportion thereof in severalty, as though she were of full age;
