

(2) THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE:

(I) THE DIVISION'S FINDINGS ON THE SAFETY TRAINING AND THE ACCIDENT RATE OF POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATORS; AND

(II) ANY RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATIVE POLICY COMMITTEE.

(F) (1) THERE IS AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON SAFETY TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATORS.

(2) THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF 11 MEMBERS.

(3) OF THE 11 ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBERS:

(I) 3 SHALL REPRESENT LABOR;

(II) 7 SHALL REPRESENT EMPLOYERS; AND

(III) 1 SHALL BE THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY OR THE COMMISSIONER'S DESIGNEE.

(4) OF THE 7 REPRESENTATIVES OF EMPLOYERS:

(I) 4 SHALL REPRESENT EMPLOYERS WITH 50 OR MORE EMPLOYEES; AND

(II) 3 SHALL REPRESENT EMPLOYERS WITH FEWER THAN 50 EMPLOYEES.

(5) IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, OF THE 7 REPRESENTATIVES OF EMPLOYERS:

(I) 1 SHALL REPRESENT ASSOCIATED BUILDING CONTRACTORS;

(II) 1 SHALL REPRESENT UTILITY CONTRACTORS;

(III) 1 SHALL REPRESENT HIGHWAY CONTRACTORS; AND

(IV) 1 SHALL REPRESENT THE PUBLIC UTILITIES OF MARYLAND.

(6) THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY OR THE COMMISSIONER'S DESIGNEE SHALL SERVE AS AN EX OFFICIO MEMBER.

(7) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

(8) THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL REPRESENT ALL THE REGIONS OF THE STATE.

(9) THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY MAY CONVENE THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE AS NEEDED TO REVIEW THE SAFETY AND
