SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 10 – Attorneys at Law and Attorneys in Fact

40.

(a) The State's Attorneys in the several counties of the State shall receive annually the respective salaries set forth for performing the duties required of them by their respective public local laws and by the public general laws, and such expenses as are provided by law and by the current practice in the several counties. The State's Attorneys shall receive annual payments for office, traveling and other expenses. All payments for salaries and expenses shall be made by the respective counties in equal monthly installments unless otherwise specified. The salaries and expenses are as follows:

(c) In Anne Arundel County:

~~(1) (i) Subject to the provisions of Article III, § 35 of the Maryland Constitution, and beginning with the term of the State's Attorney who is elected to that position in [1986] 1990, the State's Attorney's salary shall be equal to the salary of a circuit court judge of the eight judicial circuits and shall be increased 5 percent for each year for the years [1988, 1989, and 1990] 1992, 1993, AND 1994 \$89,000.~~

(1) (1) THE STATE'S ATTORNEY'S ANNUAL SALARY IS \$89,000.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary or compensation of the State's Attorney of Anne Arundel County in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the State's Attorney of Anne Arundel County shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.

SECTION 2 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.
