RESOLVED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That each of the treasurers of this state be, and they hereby are authorised and empowered, to close the accounts of public debtors, on their having paid, since eighteen hundred and twenty-one, or upon their paying hereafter, the principal sums of their debts due unto the state, with interest thereon at six *per centum per annum*.
