WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the report of the late state's agent of the western shore, that the heirs of the late Thomas Hall, of Harford county, have generally, or the most of them, relinquished all claim to the lands referred to in the resolution No. 45, passed at December session 1824; Therefore,

RESOLVED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the attorney-general be and he hereby is authorised and empowered to sell, or otherwise dispose of, the said lands, on the best obtainable terms, subject to the revision and approbation of the treasurer of the western shore.

In favour of Jane
Beatty

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Jane Beatty, of Pittsburgh, in Pennsylvania, or to her order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for her husband, William Beatty's services during the revolutionary war.

John Clare

RESOLVED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore credit the account of John Clare, who was sheriff of Calvert county in the year eighteen hundred and sixteen, and eighteen hundred and seventeen, with the interest which has accrued on the sum of ninety-nine dollars, from the date of the judgment in which the said ninety-nine dollars were included, for which sum allowance was made to the said Clare by a resolution of the last session.

Harris and Johnson's
Reports

RESOLVED, That the governor and council be and they hereby are authorised, to purchase one hundred and twenty-five copies of the first volume of Harris and Johnson's Reports, and cause them to be distributed and forwarded as follows: To the court of appeals for each shore two copies, to each county court one copy, to the general assembly four copies, to the chancellor one copy, to each of the judges of the court of appeals and county courts one copy, to each of the judges of Baltimore city court one copy, to the library of congress two copies, and that the other copies remain in the council chamber subject to the future disposition of the legislature.

RESOLVED, That the governor and council cause the second and third volumes of Harris and Johnson's Reports, and such
