Printed in the *Maryland Journal* on March 28, 1786 and probably published in pamphlet form at the same time. It contains valuable material on the leading problems before the Virginia legislature. The sentiment later reflected by the Annapolis Convention in September, 1786 is shown in this interesting item: "We pray therefore for the day, when we shall see a National Convention sit, composed of the best and ablest men in the Union, a majority of whom shall be invested with the power of *altering* it [i.e. the Articles of Confederation.]"
