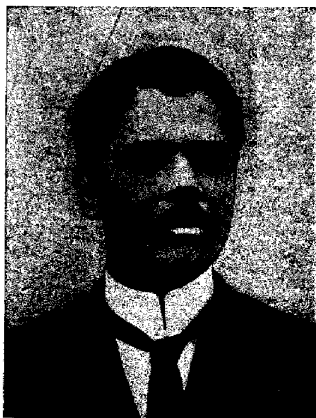




CHARLES H. ANDERSON
