No. 6.

Resolution in favor of Captain William Camp, of Kent County. Passed Feb 25, 1835

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Armourer at Annapolis, be and he is hereby required to deliver to Captain William Camp, of Kent county, a number of swords and pistols, not exceeding sixty of each, with appropriate accoutrements, which the said armourer may select, on his giving bond and such security for the safe keeping and return of the same, as the Governor and Council may require.

No. 7.

Resolution relative to the copy of the Judicial Reports to be presented to the British Government. Passed Mar 17,

*Resolved,* That the Librarian be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to procure and have bound in suitable manner, a complete set of the Judicial Reports of the State of Maryland, to be presented in conformity with the proposition of the Library Commission to the British Government; and that the Librarian do so in pursuance of the Senate and House of Delegates, be enlarged and extended upon, and be requested in that manner to transmit the same in the high sense of the liberality and magnanimity of the British Government, and to transmit with their communication, a copy of this resolution.
