The Deposition of Joseph Silghman aged thirty seven years on the oath being sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God Depoant saith that about thirty six or thirty seven years ago he was in the Woods with Aaron Silghman and he asked where Solomon Silghmans Boundary was and says Aaron Silghman as this Depoant Remembers told him that there stood this Depoants Brother Solomon Silghmans Boundary which said Boundary was a scumbled white Oak that stood to the Eastward and where now stands a marked light wood post marked with sixteen Notches or thereabouts now in the old field and further this Depoant saith not taken this fifteenth Day of August Anno Domini 1761
