Emanuel Hurst of Kent County Planter at last August Court acknowledged himself indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of this Province in the sume of ten pound Sterling Conditionally that if he should not appear at the next November Court to give Evidence on behalf of his said Lordship against William Burk and the s^d Emanuel being sick and not able to appear the s^d Recognizance was respited from said November Court untill this Court and now here at this Court to wit at the Third Tuesday of March it being made appears to the Justices here that the said Emanuel is sick that he cannot appear without Danger of his life thereupon the said Emanuel's Recognizance is discharged —

Ordered that Abraham Redgrave Surety for Ann Hurst his Recognizance be Discharged she being as an Evidence against the s^d William Burk —

Abraham Redgrave of Kent County Gentry at Last Court did acknowledge himself indebted unto the Right Honourable the Lord Prop^y of this Province his heirs and Successors in the sume of five pounds Sterling to be made and Levied on his Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if Ann Hurst ^{should} not make her personal appearance at the then next Court to be held for County to wit the Seventeenth Day of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and twenty three the s^d Ann Hurst appears and thereupon the s^d Abra^m Redgraves Recognizance is Discharged

M.H. His Lordship — The s^d George Kennards having Entered into Recognizance at last Court for his appearance to this Court on Suspicion of Entertaining prisoners that made their Escape ^{and words of this s^d George Kennards appeared} from the Sher^{ts} of this County Order that his Recognizance and his Surety's Recognizances be Discharged —
