indicted Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here this twenty of Days of
March Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and twenty four that though ^{afterwards} ~~the~~ Garret
Crosby stand for the space of one hour in the pillory, And receive at the
publick whipping post fifteen Lashes well laid on his bare Back till the
blood appears for his said Crime of Committing felony as also that he
pay to Fredth Hanson four pounds being to the value of Six Shillings
Current money the Goods stolen being valued at one Shilling & Six pence
Current money also it is adjudged that the s^d. Garret Crosby pay the
Sum of Eight hundred and twenty two pounds of Tobacco Costs Accruing
on the promises ~~to~~ the officers of this Court —

Ordered that the Sheriff of Thout County take the s^d. Garret Crosby & set
him in the pillory there to remain for the time above. Then to set him
to the whipping post and receive the Lashes in the Judgment of the Justices
afterwards to bring him into Court again of which s^d. Procept the s^d.
Sheriff viz^t Fredth Hanson Gent make return on the Day & year last
said that he hath executed the Judgment of the Justices and also that he hath
brought the s^d. Garret Crosby before the Court —

The s^d. Garret Crosby having been committed into the Sheriff's custody
for his appearance During Court sitting And now s^d. Gar^t. having
appeared he is discharged from his commitment —

Ordered that the Sheriff of Thout County keep him the s^d. Garret Crosby
in safe custody until he shall give security for of four pounds amounting
to Six Shillings Current money and of Sum of Eight hundred and
twenty two pounds of Tob. Costs Accruing on s^d. Judgment —
