 his body Goods and Chatter, Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lord Ship his heirs and Successors  
 Conditionally That if the ap<sup>d</sup> Gilbert Tate shall not make his personal appearance at any  
 time during this Courts sitting to answer unto what shall be objected against him on the said  
 Lord Ships behalf concerning an assault and that in the mean time he is to be of good  
 behav<sup>r</sup> wherewith the said James Smith acknowledg<sup>s</sup> himselfe Content

After which the same Gilbert came into Court and in his p<sup>r</sup>sonal p<sup>r</sup>son<sup>e</sup> and prays  
 his Recognizance and his Sureties may be def<sup>d</sup> by  
 Gilbert Tate of his Recognizance taken in the Sum of five pounds Sterl for his ap<sup>d</sup>  
 good behav<sup>r</sup> as and nothing app<sup>r</sup> against him his Recognizance and the said James Smith  
 for his appearance & good behav<sup>r</sup> as and is by this Court Encl<sup>d</sup> up<sup>d</sup>

His Ship } M<sup>r</sup> Fred<sup>r</sup> Hanson one of the Justices of this Court Complaining  
 Pat. Clarke } the ap<sup>d</sup> Pat. Clarke on which the Court ord<sup>r</sup> that was to be  
 out to the Sheriff in ord<sup>r</sup> to bring the same before this Court.

after which came Joseph Young Gent High Sheriff of  
 said County and returned the same to the Court and that he hath ready the same Patrick and  
 the ap<sup>d</sup> Patrick in his p<sup>r</sup>sonal p<sup>r</sup>son<sup>e</sup> appears to the same and that the ap<sup>d</sup> Fred<sup>r</sup> Hanson  
 comes into Court and said that the ap<sup>d</sup> Patrick had very grossly abused him as a Justice of  
 the Peace the ap<sup>d</sup> Pat in defence of the allegations and saith that he can produce several  
 evid<sup>nc</sup> concerning the same but are not at Court therefore pray that the same may be  
 sent unto next Court which is granted and that Security be given accordingly

 Fred<sup>r</sup> Hanson as one of the Justices of this County and in the mean time he is to be  
 of good behav<sup>r</sup> wherewith he acknowledg<sup>s</sup> himselfe Content

At the same time Nicholas Pace of the ap<sup>d</sup> County here p<sup>r</sup>sent in Court comes and  
 acknowledged himselfe indebted to the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> in the Sum of thirty
