The nineteenth day of March Anno Domini Seven hundred
 and twenty seven makes return that he hath here ready
 two books as by his precept he was commanded And now
 hereafterwards to wit the day and year last mentioned
 came again the said Lord prop^r and Phil^r Shuck by their
 Attys^r and the Jurors of that Jury being Impannell'd
 and called likewise came to wit Sam^l. Groom Samuel
 Joady Robert Dunn Jun^r. Abram Ambrood John Coad
 Robert Greenett Humphry Younger Arthur Jordan
 Nath^l. Howard Griffith Jones Edward Worrell Jun^r.
 Mapwell who being duly Votid by God and Sworn to
 say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do
 say that the said Phil^r is guilty as he stands indicted
 and by Samuel Groom their foreman all so say &c.

Ordered that the Sheriff of the County keep the said Phil^r
 in safe custody until the Judgment shall be rendered
 on the Verdict of the Jurors afo^r and that the Court may
 thereupon further Advise and that he give good Security
 for his Appearance and good behaviour to next Court to
 Answer the same

At which said next Court to wit the eighteenth day of
 June Anno Domini Seven hundred and twenty eight
 came again the said Shillomon Church in his proper
 person and the said Lord prop^r by Jacob Francis Clerk
 of Indulments and the said Cause being for the Court to
 render Judgment on the Verdict of the Jurors afo^r the
 said Court having not fully considered the same the said
 Cause further continued until the then next Court that
 they may therein further Advise

At which said Court to wit the 20th day of August Anno
 Domini 1728 came again the said Clerk of Indulments
 the said Shillomon in his proper person to Answer
 unto the Verdict of Jurors afo^r whereupon the Court
 having fully considered the Issues in relation to the
 Verdict
