And now here at this Court viz. this 19<sup>th</sup> Day of Novemb. Anno Domini 1728 James  
 the said John Lovogrove by James Calder his Attty and Saith that he is not in any Sort  
 guilty of what is above alleged &c.<sup>o</sup>

And the said William Gallaway Saith that he is not Master of the trade the said  
 John Lovogrove was to learn him. And the Court having heard the Allegations on both  
 Sides and mature deliberation being by the Court thereupon taken &c. Therefore it is  
 considered by the Court here viz. This 11<sup>th</sup> month day of Novemb. Anno Domini One  
 Thousand Seven hundred and twenty eight That there be taken nothing by the Orphan  
 Court of the orphans Jury and But that the said John Lovogrove go thereof without day  
 &c. And that the said John Lovogrove Recover against the said William Gallaway the  
 Sum of two hundred and four pounds of Tobacco Cash expended about his defence in the  
 premises &c.

 } this Court on the 28<sup>th</sup> Sep. 1728 ordered to give Security for her  
 } to the then next Court to answer unto what should be objected ag<sup>t</sup> her  
 } on this Lordships behalf on suspicion of feloniously Stealing &  
 } bearing away some Goods and Chattels belonging to a certain Francis Pool

And at the same time Walter Collins her husband with John Austin her Surety entered into  
 Recognizance in the Sum of five pounds Sterl to be recovered &c. if in case the said Rebecca should  
 not appear at the then next Court and to answer unto what should be objected against her on  
 this Lordships behalf and that in the mean time she was to be of good behav. &c. And now at  
 this Court viz. this 19<sup>th</sup> Day of Novemb. Anno Domini 1728 the Court to which the said  
 Rebecca was to appear and answer came the said Rebecca in her proper person and  
 appeared and desired her Surety Recognizance for her appearance might be disp<sup>d</sup> and  
 nothing being offered to the contrary It is ordered by the Court here that the said  
 Walter Collins and John Austin Recognizance be disp<sup>d</sup> The same is by this Court here  
 disp<sup>d</sup> &c.

At the same time as did Francis Pool ent<sup>r</sup> into recognizance before the said  
 Justice as prosecut<sup>r</sup> ag<sup>t</sup> the said Rebecca in the Sum of ten pounds Sterl &c. and  
 now at this Court came the said Francis in his proper person and appeared and prayed that  
 his recognizance as might be disp<sup>d</sup> Ordered by the Court here that the said Recognizance  
 be disp<sup>d</sup> The same Recognizance is by this Court here disp<sup>d</sup> &c.

The Grand Jury having returned an Indictment ag<sup>t</sup> the said Rebecca Collins for  
 feloniously Stealing some Goods & Chattels of a certain Francis Pool Indorsed Bill  
 Vora Sam Wikes Foreman } The said Rebecca was called into  
 Court on the same And in her proper person appeared It is ordered by the  
 Court here that she give Surety for her appearance at next Court then to  
 answer unto the same Indictm<sup>t</sup> and that in the mean time she is to be of good  
 behaviour Thereupon came into Court Walter Collins husband of the  
 said Rebecca and acknowledged himselfe Indict<sup>d</sup> to the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord  
 Proprietarie his heirs and Successors in the Sum of Ten pounds Sterling to be  
 levied
