And the said Francis Pool comes and saith that he cannot gain say the Indenture
 as to it and brought nor but that he is guilty of the premises upon him imposed as
 it is by the said Indenture alleged and thereupon submits to the Court Therefore
 it is considered by the Court here by At the Court House in the Town of Chester
 in said County on the Third Tuesday in June being the seventeenth day of said
 Month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and twenty nine That the said Francis
 Pool pay the sum of twelve hundred pounds of Tobacco Debt according to Act
 of Assembly in such case lately made and provided for his offence for committing
 adultery as aforesaid and also pay the sum of five hundred and three pounds
 of Tobacco Debt according to his promise as to the Honor of his Court

ORDERED by the Court here that Joseph Young Gent. High Sheriff of said County keep
 the said Francis Pool in safe custody until the fine of twelve hundred pounds of
 Tobacco and the costs of the said shall be paid

ordered by the Court that the Sheriff should keep the said Francis in custody
 for his appearance during the Courts sitting. Thereupon the said Francis Pool
 in his proper person did acknowledge himself indebted to the Right Hon^{ble}
 the Lord Prop^r his heirs & Successors in the sum of ten pounds Sterling to
 be levied on his goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements conditionally that if
 he shall not appear at any time during the Courts sitting to answer unto
 what should be objected against him on his Lordships behalf and to be of good
 behaviour wherewith he acknowledges himself content

Like wise came into Court Arthur Fordman & Donnell Houflagh and
 acknowledged themselves indebted to the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Prop^r in
 his heirs and Successors in the sum of five pounds Sterling each to be
 levied on their goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements conditionally that if
 the said Francis Pool shall not appear at any time during the Courts sitting
 to answer unto what shall be objected against him on his Lordships behalf and to
 be of good behaviour &c. wherewith they acknowledge themselves to be content

after which came againe into Court the said Francis Pool in his proper person
 and ~~presently~~ appeared and prayed his recognizance and his Sureties might be dispensed
 ordered by the Court here that his said recognizance and his Sureties be dispensed
 The said Francis Pool's recognizance and his Sureties are by this Court
 here dispensed &c.
