A Joint Resolution directing the Governor to proclaim October 28th of each year for the observance and commemoration of the founding of the Republic of Czechoslovakia.

WHEREAS, The 28th day of October, 1918, is the date on which the Republic of Czechoslovakia was founded; and

WHEREAS, The United States was the first country through public announcement of the Secretary of State, on June 3, 1918, to express sympathy with the purpose of Prof. Thomas G. Masaryk and his fellow countrymen to establish a Republic; and

WHEREAS, The said Prof. Thomas G. Masaryk was elected first President of Czechoslovakia on November 14, 1918, and has been re-elected three times since then, the last time in May, 1934, at the age of 84; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that the recurring anniversary of this day be commemorated with suitable patriotic and public exercises in observing and commemorating the founding of this great sister Republic in Europe; therefore be it

*Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland,* That the Governor of the State of Maryland be and
