

CHAPTER 375.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Chapter No. 299 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1927, and Chapter No. 307 of the Acts of the General Assmby of Maryland, Session of 1929, as said Acts were edited by Horace E. Flack and incorporated in Article 16 of the Public Local Laws of Maryland, as Section 691-701, inclusive, so as to authorize the County Commissioners of Montgomery County to increase the number of police officers to twenty-seven, to authorize the appointment and compensation of two additional sergeants and one additional first class patrolman, to authorize the appointment and provide for the compensation of four park policemen, and the establishment of a Bureau of Criminal Identification, and to provide for the levying of the cost thereof.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Chapter No. 299 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1927, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Chapter 259 of the Acts of the Genreal Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1922, entitled 'An Act to authorize, empower and direct the County Commissioners of Montgomery County to appoint three or more, not exceeding six additional constables for Montgomery County at large on the first Tuesday of July in the year 1922 for a term of two years from the date of the appointment, and to provide rules and regulations governing the duties of said constables and provide for their compensation and the expenses of equipment, said constables to be known and designated as "Montgomery County Police."
