

LAWS OF MARYLAND OF 1950

MARYLAND, Sct.:

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held in the City of Annapolis, on the First day of February, 1950, and ending on the Second day of March, 1950, the Honorable William Preston Lane, Jr., being Governor of the State, the following Laws were enacted, to wit:

CHAPTER 1

(Senate Bill 3)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, sub-sections 180 (c) and (d) of Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supplement), title "Revenue and Taxes", sub-title "State Tax Commission", as said sub-sections were amended by Chapter 64 of the Acts of the Extraordinary Session of 1948, and to add a new sub-section to said section 180, said new sub-section to be known as (d-1) and to follow immediately after sub-section (d) thereof, relating to the payment of compensation of the assessors of the several counties and of Baltimore City and to the appointment and removal of assessors in Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sub-sections 180 (c) and (d) of Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supplement), title "Revenue and Taxes", sub-title "State Tax Commission", as said sub-sections were amended by Chapter 64 of the Acts of the Extraordinary Session of 1948, be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, and that a new sub-section be and it is hereby added to said section 180, said new sub-section to be known as (d-1) and to follow immediately after sub-section (d) thereof, all to read as follows:*

(c) The annual salary of each assessor shall be determined by the classification of his respective county *or of Baltimore*
