SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That section ninety-seven of the twelfth article of the code of Public Local Laws, which authorises the levy of a tax for the support of public schools in Harford county, and one hundred and eighth, which authorises the executive board of school commissioners to procure school houses and lots for the use of public schools be and the same are hereby repealed, and that this act shall take effect from its passage. CHAPTER 86.

AN ACT to incorporate a company to make a turnpike from Conowingo to Belair. Passed Feb. 17, 1860.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a company shall be incorporated to make a turnpike road from Conowingo to Belair in Harford county. Incorporated:

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That subscription books shall be opened on the first Monday in May next in Harford county and the city of Baltimore, for a capital stock of said company of forty thousand dollars, in two thousand shares, of twenty dollars each, under the direction of the following commissioners or any one of them, namely, in Harford county: Otho Scott, Henry A. Silver, William Lee Amos, Samuel Galloway, James McCormack, John W. Webster, John F. Galbreath, Edward Quarles, William M. Ady, Chenney Hoskins, David G. McCoy, Isaac Scarborough, Hugh Canagan, Jacob Minnick, Hugh C. Whiteford, Frank Whitaker, Edward Reynolds, Hugh Jones; in Baltimore: Darius Stansbury, J. L. Wright, George I. Kennard. Capital stock.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That when three hundred shares of said stock shall have been subscribed, the commissioners shall give notice in two newspapers of said county of the time and place appointed for the subscribers to meet, to organize said institution. Election of president and directors.
