CHAPTER 5.

Passed Jan. 30, 1860. AN ACT to compensate Charles W. Webster for professional services rendered under appointment of the Governor, in the Court of Appeals, in the case of Josiah Parish vs. the State of Maryland.

Authorised to pay. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and directed, on the warrant of the Comptroller, to pay to the order of Charles W. Webster, the sum of two hundred dollars, for professional services rendered by him under appointment of the Governor, in the Court of Appeals, in the case of Josiah Parish vs. the State of Maryland.

In force. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 6.

Passed Feb. 2, 1860. AN ACT to repeal the seven hundred and sixth section, of the fourth article of the Code of Public Local Laws, which gives to the Mayor of the city of Baltimore and the Judge of the Criminal Court of Baltimore, and the Judge of the Superior Court of Baltimore, the power to order out the Militia.
