

Passed Mar. 10, 1842. Preamble and Resolution directing the Librarian to perform certain duties in relation to the last census, &c.

WHEREAS, by a Resolution of Congress, number six, approved by the President, September first, eighteen hundred and forty-one, the State of Maryland is entitled to one hundred and ninety of the printed copies of the last Census of the United States—therefore,

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* the State Librarian be and he is hereby authorized and directed to apply to the Secretary of State, of the United States, for the said one hundred and ninety copies of the last census of the United States, and that so soon as the said Librarian shall have received the same, he shall cause them to be distributed in the following manner, namely: one copy thereof to each of the Senators of this State, one copy to each of the Delegates in this House, one copy to be deposited in the Executive Chamber, one copy to be forwarded to each of the Clerks and Registers offices of the several counties of this State, in the same manner that the Laws and Votes and Proceedings of the Legislature are forwarded, and the remaining numbers of said census to be deposited in the State Library.

## No. 10.

Passed Mar. 10, 1842. Resolution directing the Secretary of State to permit George Bancroft to have certain Documents, &c.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* the Secretary of State be authorized to deliver to George Bancroft, Esquire, author of the History of the United States, any manuscripts in the Council Chamber, referring to the Revolutionary period of the History of Maryland, on condition that the same be returned to the archives of the State within a reasonable time, the said Secretary making a catalogue, and taking a receipt for the same.
