Any inhabitant of this State may go before the courts of, &c. or to any judge of court not in session, and make oath that he believes or suspects a person having license to sell, &c. deals unlawfully with free negroes or mulattos or is in the habit of receiving stolen goods, courts upon such oath to issue summons to such person to appear and answer, and if satisfied that such person as generally reported to sell, &c. contrary to law, to take away license, if license taken away, such person may appeal to next county or district court, &c.
