THE FOLLOWING LAWS WERE ENACTED, TO WIT :

CHAPTER 1.

CHAP. 1.

An act to allow further time to Stephen H. Gough, sheriff of Saint Mary's County, to execute his bond for the year eighteen hundred and forty-four.

Passed Dec.
30, 1843.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Stephen H. Gough, sheriff of St. Mary's county, be and he is hereby, allowed until the thirtieth day of January, in the year eighteen hundred and forty-four, to execute his bond to the State, as sheriff of St. Mary's county, for the year eighteen hundred and forty-four, and that said bond, if executed and approved, on or before that day, shall be as valid and binding on said sheriff and his sureties, as if executed within the time limited by law.

Time allowed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That all official acts done, or to be done and performed by said sheriff, after he shall have bonded as aforesaid, shall be as valid and effectual in law,
