

CHAPTER 186.

CHAP. 186.

An act to divorce James H. Knotts, of Queen Ann's county, from his wife, Catharine Knotts. Passed Mar. 15, 1839.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Divorce
That James H. Knotts, of Queen Ann's county, be, and he is hereby divorced from his wife, Catherine Knotts, *a vinculo matrimonii.*

CHAPTER 187.

An act to divorce Mary Ann Rector, of the City of Baltimore, from her husband, George Rector. Passed Mar. 15, 1839.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Divorce
That Mary Ann Rector, of the city of Baltimore, be, and she is hereby divorced from her husband, George Rector, *a vinculo matrimonii.*

CHAPTER 188.

A supplement to an act entitled, an act to lay out and open a road, from the town of Westminster, in Frederick (now in Carroll county,) to the City of Washington and George Town. Passed Mar. 16, 1839.

WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly of Maryland, by sundry citizens of Carroll county, that the interests of many of them would be greatly promoted, while the convenience of none would be interrupted, by a proposed alteration in the road leading from Westminster to Washington and Georgetown: Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Benjamin Fowler, John Miller and Michael Barnits, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to open a new road, in the stead of that now in use, to commence for the same, at the point where the said road is intersected by the road leading to the residence of Col. Joshua Gist, and following the outskirts of a certain strip of land, bordering upon the

Commissioners named and authorized.
