 parade, shall be fined a sum not exceeding five dollars,
 nor less than fifty cents.

Sec. 12. *And be it enacted,* That all fines authorised Court martial-fines
 by this act, may be determined by a court martial, to
 be detailed for the purpose, by the commanding officer
 of the regiment, and may be collected in the name of
 the State, for the use of the regiment, before any jus-
 tice of the peace, as other small debts are collected;
provided, that a certificate of a majority of the court
 martial, determining and ordering the same, shall be
