

CHAPTER 137.

CHAP. 138.

A supplement to the several acts Incorporating the Town of Hagerstown, in Washington County. Passed Jan. 18, 1840.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, the voters of Hagerstown shall elect one moderator for said town, annually, by general ticket, and that each ward of said town shall elect one commissioner annually. Moderator to be elected annually, &c. And one com. from each ward

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That no voter shall be allowed to vote in any other ward than the one in which he resides, nor for any individual other than one residing in said voter's ward, nor shall any person be qualified to act as commissioner for any ward unless he shall have been resident therein for six months next before the election. Voter to vote in ward he resides Qualification of commissioner

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the manner of conducting all elections under this act, shall be prescribed and regulated by the commissioners who shall be in office next before the election for moderator and commissioners as aforesaid; *provided,* that polls shall be opened in each ward of said town, at said election. Manner of conducting elect'n.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That all acts of Assembly relating to said town are continued in full force, except such as are inconsistent with the provisions of this act. In force

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That the moderator of said town, who shall have been elected as aforesaid, shall preside at the meetings of said commissioners, and shall only have a casting vote in case of a tie. Duty of moderator

CHAPTER 138.

An act to grant to Joseph Graham, former Sheriff of Talbot County, further time to complete his collections. Passed Jan. 21, 1840.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the time limited by law within which Joseph Graham, former sheriff of Talbot county, shall have made his collections, be and the same is hereby extended to the first day of December in the year eighteen hundred and forty-one. Time extended
