Dear Mr. Speaker:

I have today vetoed House Bill No. 859, which is returned herewith. This Bill would add a section to the general election laws requiring the Anne Arundel County Supervisors of Elections to designate an additional polling place in the Third Election District of Anne Arundel County, in the area presently served by the Arnold Fire Department.

The Supervisors already have general authority to add additional polling places, and a specific direction such as this has no proper place in the general state-wide election laws. It is a matter to be addressed to the discretion of the Board, rather than attempting to make such a minute detail of administrative action the subject of legislative action.
