No. 44.

Resolution in favor of James H. Coulter.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Passed March
7, 1845.

No. 45.

Resolution requiring the Orphans' Court of Calvert County, to invest the School Fund of said County.

Passed March
7, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That
the Orphans' court of Calvert county be, and they are hereby required and directed to invest from time to time, as they may deem necessary, any surplus monies belonging to the common school fund of said county, in stock of the Farmer's Bank of Maryland, or in any other manner best calculated to promote said fund.

No. 46.

Resolution relative to the Printing of the Laws.

Passed March
10, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland That
the printer of the laws of this session, and all future sessions, shall print the same immediately after the adjournment of the Legislature, and that he deliver them to the respective counties of this State, on or before the twentieth day of May next, and annually thereafter on the same day, and in case of failure to do so, he shall forfeit and pay to the State, the sum of two hundred dollars, to be deducted by the Governor out of his account for printing said laws.
