*Resolution directing the Clerk of Calvert County, to cause to be made out an Index, &c.*

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* the clerk of Calvert county court be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to make, or cause to be made, in suitable books, a general index of the land records in the clerk's office of said county, and the levy court of Calvert county are hereby authorised to contract with the said clerk, upon such terms as they may deem most advantageous, for the indexing the said land records, provided it shall not exceed the sum of five hundred dollars; and the said levy court may levy on the assessable property of said county such sum or sums of money as shall be necessary to carry into effect the foregoing resolution.
