sion, thence to Q. at the south end of the line forming the eastern limit of the tract of land called Maidstone, thence with said line of Maidstone to the end thereof, and thence in the same direction until it strikes Lyons Creek, thence down the said creek to the river Patuxent.

Survey, plats, records.

2. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall as soon as convenient, employ a competent surveyor, with such other persons as they or a majority of them may deem necessary, and cause the aforementioned lines to be carefully run and bounded as before directed, and the said surveyor shall make out two plats thereof, with an explanation accompanying each, distinctly and plainly setting forth and describing the beginning and termination of the aforesaid Divisional Line, and of each and every course or line comprehended in said Divisional Line expressly calling for in each explanation, and shewing on each Plat, every boundary stone so as aforesaid to be planted, one of which said Plats, and explanations, shall be returned to the county court, of each county aforesaid to be recorded among the land records of the said counties.

Line estab-

3. And be it enacted, That as soon as the said lines and boundaries shall be fixed, settled, and established as aforesaid by the commissioners, or a majority of them, and the plats and explanations returned as aforesaid, that the same shall forever thereafter be considered as the permanent Divisional Line or Lines and bounds between the said counties of Anne Arundel and Calvert.

Expenses.

4. And be it enacted, That all expenses incurred by this act, shall be paid, the one half by Anne Arundel county, and the other half by Calvert county, to be levied on the assessable property of said counties.

Levy:

5. And be it enacted, That the levy court of each of the aforesaid counties, are hereby authorised and required to levy as aforesaid the amount of expenses so to be incurred, a list of which shall be furnished to the levy court of each county, by the commissioners or a majority of them, and the money, so levied, when collected shall be paid over to the persons, entitled to receive it, on their producing a certificate stating the amount of their claim signed by one or more of the said commissioners.

6. And be it enacted, That the commissioners and surveyor shall be allowed at the rate of three dollars per day, and all other persons necessarily employed shall be allowed at the rate of one dollar per day, while engaged in the establishment of the aforementioned line.

CHAPTER 184.

PassedFeb 24, 1824. An act to make public an old Road leading from Coalsville in Montgomery County, to intersect the public road leading from Vansville in Prince George's County at or near the Paint Chapel in said county.

SEC. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John Bailey, James Valdenear, Jacob Camp, Samuel Perry, Thomas Beall and Josiah Jones, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to widen, straighten, amend and make public an old road, (not exceeding thirty feet wide) commencing at Coalsville in Montgomery county, and thence passing immediately by Jacob Camp's Mills, on the paint branch to intersect the county road leading from Vansville in Prince George's county at or near the paint chapel in said county, provided this road shall be laid out at the expense of those persons who shall conceive themselves benefitted thereby.
