SEC. 2 AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said Abel Gouty shall apply the money to the payment of legal claims against the said deceased, and shall then deliver the balance of the money, (if any) to the orphan's court, to be applied under the direction of said court in the following manner, to wit: one third part to the widow, and the balance amongst the children of the said deceased equally.

CHAPTER 27.

An act to authorise the Banks in this State to issue small notes for a limited time, and for other purposes.

Passed Dec. 29, 1814.

SEC. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the several Banking Institutions within this state, be and they are hereby authorised to issue bank notes, on good fine paper, of any denomination less than five dollars.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That either of the said banks may invest such portion of its capital as may be thought advantageous to the institution in stock of the United States, or in the stock of any bank now or hereafter chartered within the United States.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That this act shall continue, and be in force until the twentieth day of November next and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

CHAPTER 28.

An act for the relief of Samuel M'Clellan and George H. Seckel of the city of Baltimore.

Passed Jan. 27, 1815.

Section 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges or any judge of Baltimore county court, be and they, or any one of them, either in open court, or in the recess of said court are hereby authorised and directed to extend to Samuel M'Clellan and George H. Seckel, and each of them, the benefit of the act of assembly, passed at November session eighteen hundred and five "entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors and the several supplements thereto, without requiring the said Samuel M'Clellan and George H.
