Also House Bill No. 157, entitled "An Act to prohibit the sale, manufacture for sale and transportation for sale of alcoholic, spirituous, vinous, malt and intoxicating liquors in Sandy Hook District, being Election District No. 11, in Washington county, Maryland." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Temperance.*]

Also House Bill No. 112, entitled "An Act authorizing and directing the Police Commissioners of Baltimore city to pay to James E. Dempsey, a retired policeman of the Baltimore City Police Department, a pension of ten dollars per week." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the City Senators.*]

Also House Bill No. 188, entitled "An Act to add two new sections to the Revised Charter of Baltimore city, to follow, respectively, Sections 43 and 48, and be designated, respectively, 43-A and 48-A; said two new sections relating to the expenses incident to tax sales." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the City Senators.*]

Also House Bill No. 152, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 8 of Article 38 of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, title 'Cecil County,' sub-title 'Birds and Game,' as amended by Chapter 715 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1908, and to re-enact the same, with amendments." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Fish and Game.*]

Also House Bill No. 264, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 35 of Article 10, Public Local Laws, title 'Dorchester County,' sub-title 'Birds and Game,' as repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 219 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session of 1912, so as to change the open season for killing squirrels." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Fish and Game.*]
