

The resolutions requesting our representatives in Congress to use their exertions to have refunded to the State of Maryland \$72,000 with interest, advanced to the General Government in 1790;

The resolution in favor of Captain James M. Schley.

And the resolution in favor of Amos Willison of R. of Allegany county.

Severally endorsed "assented to."

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of George W. Morgan, late sheriff of St. Mary's county.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act in aid of the construction of an out let lock of the Tide Water canal at Bell's Ferry in Harford county, immediately opposite Port Deposit in Cecil county.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise the appointment of justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore with limited jurisdiction, passed at December session 1825, chapter 189.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal the first and second sections of an act passed December session, 1841, chapter 186, entitled, an additional supplement to an act to regulate sales by public auction, passed at December session 1827, chapter 111.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the approval of trustees' bonds and injunction bonds.

The bill entitled, an act relating to Anne Arundel county;

Severally endorsed "will pass."

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act of 1835, ch. 201, so far as the same relates to Harford county;

Endorsed—"will pass with the proposed amendment."

Amendment proposed :

Strike out the second section and insert :

"And be it enacted, That to subserve the public convenience, and to give the citizen his election of tribunal in cases of contest, and not to force him against his consent into the district courts, that hereafter in all cases of attachment, replevin, trover, and in all cases for unliquidated damages, the jurisdiction of the said district courts shall not be exclusive but concurrent with the county court; and it is further declared that the right of appealing from the decision of a justice of the peace to the said district courts, is hereby repealed;"

Which was read and laid on the table.

The bill entitled, an act giving the assent of the Legislature to the last will and testament of Rebecca Rooker.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Marien Lamar of Prince George's county.

And the bill entitled, an act to repeal the act of 1832, ch. 230;
