

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

Insert after the word "measurement" in the second and fifth lines of the ninth section, the words "or inspector."

On motion of Mr. Handy of Worcester,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

Insert after the word "city" in the fourth line of the ninth section, the following, "or counties where such inspection is made."

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

Insert after the word "dollars" in the fourteenth line of the ninth section, the words "and costs."

On motion of Mr. Lecompte of Dorchester,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

Strike out in the second line of the tenth section, the words "three-fourths of."

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

Strike out the word "either" in the sixth and ninth lines of the twelfth section, and insert the word "any."

On motion of Mr. Starr,

The seventeenth section of said bill was stricken out.

Mr. Yellott then moved to amend the said bill by adding at the end of the nineteenth section, the following:

"Provided, That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to compel any person or persons who may purchase any lumber at Port Deposit or Havre de Grace for private use, and not for the purpose of re-sale, to have the same inspected by the inspectors of the city of Baltimore;"

Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

The said amendment was amended by inserting after the word "Havre de Grace," the words "and city of Baltimore."

The question then recurred on assenting to the said amendment as amended;

And on being put, it was assented to.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill.

Mr. Janney then moved to refer the said bill to the consideration of the next General Assembly;

On the question being put,

It was determined in the negative.

The question again recurred on the passage of the said bill;

And on being put, it was passed.

On motion of Mr. Starr,

The title of said bill was amended by adding thereto the words "and for other purposes."

The said bill was then sent to the Senate.
